For the second time in the company's 23 year history we have embarked on a rebranding exercise in line with some significant operational changes and initiatives across the group.

The company's logo and aircraft livery have changed and you will begin to see some of these changes implemented throughout the organization in our aircraft, uniforms, buildings and documentation. The Bird of Paradise yellow and green logo that served us for 17 years has been replaced by an orange **H** symbolising a combination of elements in our industry such as a helipad, aircraft propeller, runway threshold and the name Hevilift itself. The colours of green, white and purple have been replaced by orange, white and purple and combined with the new monotone logo eliminates one colour from the livery pallet.

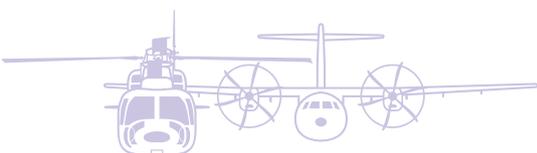
